A WORD FROM OUR MANAGER AND CHAIRPERSON

After the disruptions and uncertainties of the previous years, it was great to begin the year with an increased **optimistic outlook** and planning approach. As a result, Richmond Community Learning Centre, RCLC, was able to deliver more activities, services, workshops, and events over the year. We also **established and strengthened partnerships** with other key local stakeholders and groups and were **successful with new grant applications**.

Our vision for 2022 was to **reconnect the community and improve well-being**, especially among women, who research, and anecdotal evidence suggested were most impacted by recent lockdowns.

We kicked off 2022 with the bang of **Chinese Drums** in the courtyard of Studio 9 to welcome the Chinese New Year. A celebration that included a bit of Zumba to warm up, a blessing from the Chinese dragons and some fun activities for the kids to join in the new year celebration.

It heralded the start of a strong and very **successful partnership with Lincoln Emersley** and the team at Ardency Place. This began **several free collaborative events** with our neighbours at Ardency.

These included a **Zumba Gold series** to mark Senior's week, an introduction to **Bollywood dance**, and short introductory **Mobility Matters series**.

In 2022 we auspiced the **Mums in Yarra (MiY)** team, who successfully received a City of Yarra Community grant to run various workshops to support the well-being of mothers and their children.

These sessions came at an important time after the **repeated lockdowns and increased isolation** that many mothers and their children had experienced. RCLC worked with Mums in Yarra and provided in-house support during Studio 1 and The Stables workshops. Many of these events had 10-20 mothers and their infants attend. The feedback was extremely positive, with mothers embracing session themes and a relaxed, inclusive environment.

Due to the **strong demand for further sessions and topics**, one of MiY's founders, Madlen Toumbourou, applied successfully for a new grant to see the workshops continue across 2023. RCLC looks forward to continuing to auspice and support the Mums in Yarra workshop series.

Our **long-standing partnership with U3A** with Bruce Townsend and Mary Walker has been resumed post-lockdowns. The stables provided a great space for U3A creatives to return to face-to-face activities and mosaic together, and rebuild friendships.

Our Mums in Yarra partnership has provided additional support opportunities and connections for new Yarra mums.

RCLC GRANTS

Children's Week & Sustainability Victoria

RCLC received a Children's Week grant that allowed them to conduct three **Bush playtime** sessions at Burnley Park. Susanna De Leijer, an expert in Bush kinder, organized a Welcome to Country, set up a mud kitchen, and created a clay space. **Children enjoyed playing in the natural habitat of Burnley Park**, surrounded by long grass, fallen logs, and trees. Parents enjoyed exploring Burnley Park's beauty with their children while all experienced the mental and physical health benefits of being in nature.

In late 2022, RCLC received news that **Sustainability Victoria** had granted them funds to launch a **new initiative - Yarra Repair Popups**. This project will operate across Alphington Community Centre, North Carlton Railway House, and RCLC, benefiting and strengthening all houses' efforts to **encourage** the community to **reuse and repair items** instead of discarding them.

MORE LEARN LOCAL (ACFE) courses for our community

We continued to deliver our **Learn Local** courses during 2022. Our student numbers were lower than expected early in the year. However, in term 4, a range of new courses were run. These boosted student numbers so that **we exceeded our ACFE delivery hours** over previous years.

In 2023 our focus is on further increasing our delivery, early in the year to demonstrate our capacity and need for additional funds. This will allow us to continue to deliver programs that meet our community's needs and interests.

CHANGES AHEAD

Goodbye to Coworking and Level 1 at Studio 1

During the year, The City of Yarra indicated that the South Richmond **Maternal Child and Health Service would relocate to Studio 1** due to their current facilities at the Richmond Library no longer being fit for purpose. **RCLC will maintain management for the ground floor at Studio 1**, including the Wominjeka room, from January 2023.

The change means our popular **coworking program and support** we offered via our community **venue hire on Level 1 will no longer be available.**

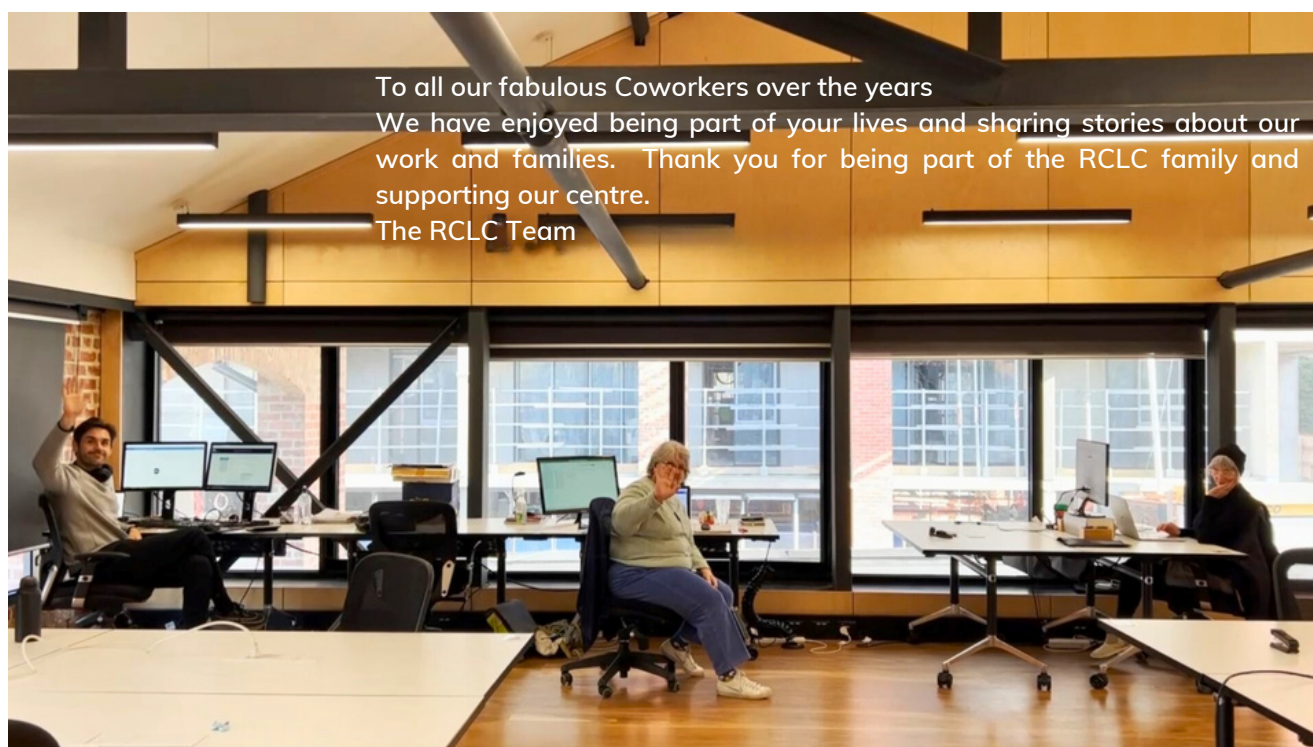
From a financial perspective, this will be a **significant loss of our self-generating income** that will require ongoing budgetary adjustments moving forward.

Messy Play

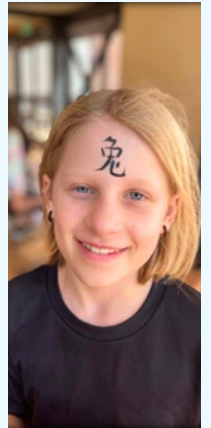

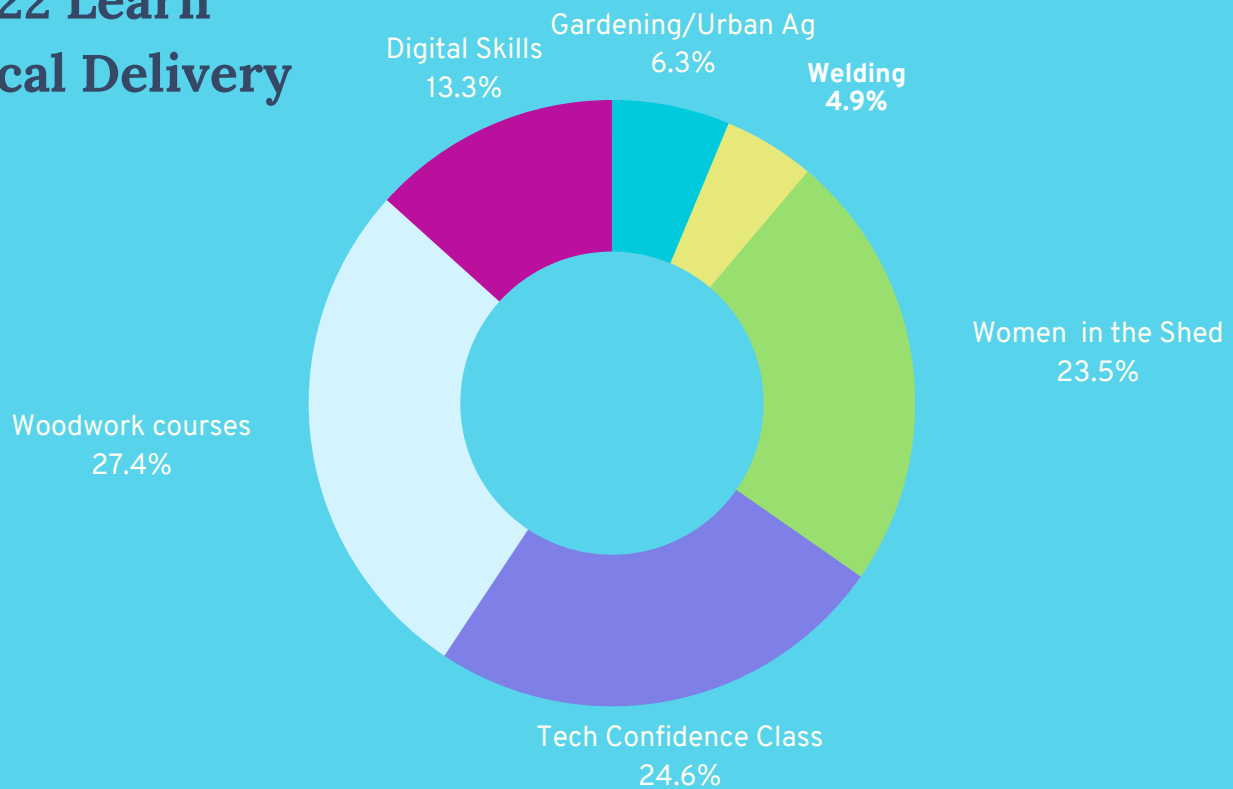

2022 Learn Local Delivery



LEARN LOCAL

RCLC has delivered significantly more Learn Local training hours in 2022, with 2828 training hours delivered across the various courses and workshops. This represents over a 40% increase in delivery from prior years.

We delivered five **Working with Timber** courses, two **Welding** workshops and a new **Furniture Refurbishment** for Women from our **Burnley Backyard workshed** in 2022. These courses are popular with our community and always fill up quickly.

Our **new woodworking facilitator, Glenn Wimetal**, has brought further energy, commitment and vision to the workshed. RCLC invested significantly in the space, and with Glenn and another new facilitator Hayley Williams the workshed has become a more active space. We would also like to **thank our former facilitator Anj** who initiated our Working with Timber courses and finished halfway through the year.

Learn Local and Other Programs

We saw a partnership developed with **Finbar Neighbourhood House** to run a new technology-based course called **Digital Skills**. Finbar did not have a similar program running, and the collaboration allowed us to offer a learning opportunity to the broader community members with minimal digital skills. Feedback from participants has been very positive, increasing their confidence living in a digital world.

We continued running our popular Introduction to **Permaculture and Urban Farming** program again in 2022, and we also added a shorter course for the 'time poor' called **Organic Gardening**. Both courses saw participants getting their hands dirty at the same time as expanding their gardening knowledge. A great connection was made between participants of Urban Farming, where a working group was formed to practice the course's teaching in participants' backyards.

The **Technology Confidence** remained strong, with a core group of learners enjoying the activity throughout the year. 2023 has seen this group transition to a HACC-supported program. Moving this group from Learn Local enabled us to apply for new shorter digital skills courses to increase digital learning access to the broader community.

As part of our continued partnership with **Alphington Neighbourhood House**, they delivered their hands-on woodworking course, Women in the Shed, each term from their facility, with over 20 people participating in these courses over the year.



COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

Something for everyone

A **collaboration with Ardency** in October which involved a month-long free Zumba Gold classes as well as special free **Bollywood Dancing** classes, was met with great support from the community. The high attendance numbers and a follow on effect, which saw our ongoing **Zumba Gold** class attendance levels increase. Morning tea followed these events in the Ardency display suite providing a great opportunity for friendships to develop.

Our other 'Health and Fitness' related **Yin Yoga and Qigong programs** have seen an increase in attendance as the year progressed. Both programs saw a strong group of participants enjoying the weekly sessions throughout the year.

Later in the year, we joined with Andrea Gaze to run a free series of **Mobility Matters sessions**.

The **Yarra Songbirds choir** has enjoyed a full year of face-to-face activity, together with some new voices joining the choir. The community enjoyed listening to their harmonious voices at our RCLC Christmas Party.

This year we were able to run our Christmas Wreath Making workshop in person for the first time rather than online. After running this workshop (twice) online during the Covid lockdown period, it was nice to offer a face-to-face version of the workshop and feedback from participants showed they enjoyed it.

Richmond Record Club

Richmond Repair Corner

After a two-year hiatus due to the Covid period, the Richmond Repair Corner has returned to action. Following our first session in May 2022, the program slowly but surely built great momentum, which saw new volunteers joining the crew and more and more community members coming in with their items.

We were lucky to have Susannah Whitty join us as the new Volunteer Coordinator in August 2022. Susannah's enthusiasm, planning, coordination, and people skills greatly benefitted the program. Attendees of the program are often grateful when their item has been fixed or even when a fix isn't possible.

Overall Result

RCLC recorded a profit of \$7,666, a 23% increase over our prior year's result of \$5,851.

Income

On the income side, RCLC grant income increased by 7% or \$23k from 2021. The increase was largely due to receiving outstanding HACC funding in 2021. Improved delivery of Learn Local courses also led to additional ACFE funding. CPI increases across the board played a small part in the funding movement.

Our programming income of \$124,807 increased by \$50,000 (65%) over the previous year due to removing Covid restrictions creating additional demand across all our income streams.

With so many local families unable to celebrate their children's birthdays during Covid, there was high demand for party hire at Burnley Backyard. Small meeting room hires also experienced significant demand increases, with local small businesses preferring to utilise these spaces as an alternative to office space.

2022 saw our Coworking program end to allow for the relocation of Maternal Child and Health to Level 1 at Studio 1. We had a dedicated group that had used the facility for several years that continued to support the program through to the end. We will miss our coworkers' presence and friendship at Studio 1.

Expenses

Wages continued to be our main expenditure item experiencing a 5% increase during the current period due to wage increases and additional programming staff. Significant cost increases occurred in facility and programming expenses, reflecting a full year of programming and facility costs.

Balance Sheet

Our balance sheet remains strong; there was a 2% reduction in net assets largely caused by a decrease in accruals in December due to expenses paid before year-end. Our cash balance remains strong, with all existing term deposits still in place. The reduction in liabilities, as highlighted previously, was due to the payment of payroll accruals in December. Staff provisions will continue to increase yearly to recognise increases in both wage rates and leave entitlements under the award.

Outlook

We have recently been notified that City of Yarra's Funding for Studio 1 will reduce by 40% due to our changing role at the centre.

This impact will be in addition to the loss of 30% of the operating income we generated from our Level 1 programs. This is a very significant amount for us, and it will take some time for us to rebuild this level of income.

2023 will require us to focus on balancing community development activities, managing operational costs and seeking new income opportunities through sponsorship, grants, sponsorship, partnership and programming.

Financial Statements

Our prepared financial statements have been prepared and fully audited by DFK Kidsons, with an unqualified audit report issued. A copy of the financial statements will be posted on our website or available by request.

Thanks to all our customers, contractors and staff for their support during the year, particularly when things don't always go to plan.

Finally, thank you to Michael, Nick, Judy and Liliana for all their support and guidance throughout the year.
